




Tove Jansson (1914-2001)


Finnish-Swedish writer and artist, who achieved worldwide fame as the creator of the Moomins, written and illustrated between 1945 and 1977. The books about the brave, adventurous, yet family-focused and homeloving Moomins have been translated into more than 50 languages and are still in print all over the world today. The Moomins were only a part of Jansson's prodigious output. Already admired in Nordic art circles as a painter, cartoonist and illustrator, she would go on to write a series of classic novels and short stories. She remains Scandinavia's bestloved author.


Moominland Midwinter

(Trollvinter) 1957, 1961 | 144 pages

Stunning colour illustrations bring out the magic in winterly Moominvalley in this classic story of Moomintroll waking up in winter time. Tove Jansson was commissioned to create six original pieces of art for an Italian edition of *Magia d'inverno* in 1961, and for the first time this colour art is available for other translations as well. The new Finnish edition is published in a slightly larger format with a cloth spine and with bigger font than the original *Moominland Midwinter*, to set this gift edition apart from the original black and white edition. This is the only original Moomin novel illustrated with colour art.

Ilon Wikland (b. 1930)

is an Estonian-born Swedish artist and illustrator. In 1944 she escaped the Soviet occupation of Estonia and arrived in Sweden as a 14-year-old refugee.

She was later educated at Swedish art school Konstfack and in 1953 Wikland applied for a job as an illustrator at Stockholm-based publisher Rabén & Sjögren, where she started working with Astrid Lindgren. Wikland has said that Lindgren's writing makes her see inner pictures. She also derives inspiration for her pictures from real life. Wikland illustrates in the the same way that Astrid Lindgren wrote - for "the child within her".

The pair worked together for many years and Wikland has illustrated some of the most appreciated works by Lindgren, including *Ronja the Robber's Daughter*, *Mardie*, *Karlsson on the Roof*, *The Children on Troublemaker Street*, and many more.

Ilon Wikland has donated over 600 of her original illustrations, now to be enjoyed at "Ilon's Wonderland", a gallery and theme centre for children and families in Haapsalu, Estonia.



Mauri Kunnas (b. 1950)






Santa's Christmas Holiday

Have you ever wondered what Santa Claus and the elves do when all the gifts are delivered? Up in the village of Korvatunturi, where the Christmas spirit is at its fullest, a well-deserved holiday break begins for everyone. It lasts for twelve days of Christmas, from Christmas Day to Epiphany. In this jolly Christmas story, we find out what happens over Santa's holiday and how the Korvatunturi folk relax.



Santa Claus

Aino Havukainen (b. 1968) and Sami Toivonen (b. 1971)

are best known as the creators of the hilarious Oddville boys, Tatu and Patu. The series includes 22 titles to date, and the riotous humour of these hugely popular illustrated books appeals to children and adults alike. Among many other awards and nominations, *Tatu and Patu: This is Finland* won the Finlandia Junior prize in 2007 and in 2017 the authors were granted the Finland State Prize for Children's Culture. In Finland Tatu and Patu books have sold over 1 million copies and the translation rights have been sold in 23 languages.



Tatu and Patu: Tremendous Train Trip

LasseMajas Detektivbyrå, (The Whodunit Detective Agency) has been translated into more than 35 languages. Widmark's books are constantly on the best-seller lists, on the libraries' most popular lists and together with Helena Willis, he has been awarded the children's own book award 11 times for the LasseMaja titles.

Helena Willis (b. 1964)

is a Swedish illustrator and author. Helena claims to have the best job in the world – "I play all day and every day". Together with Martin Widmark, she has been creating the book series of LasseMajas Detektivbyrå, "The Whodunit Detective Agency" since 2002.




You Are Super Loved

Nominated for the Finlandia Prize in 2017. Translated into Danish, German, Norwegian, Russian, Swedish and Turkish.




My Super Bellybutton

This sequel is an uplifting and reassuring book about body awareness and appreciating yourself just the way you are. "I have nice feet I can run with. Hands to do many things with. Ears, eyes, nose and mouth, all my very own. In the middle of my tummy sits a tiny button, my super cool belly button! Every part of me is just the perfect size."





I Feel Super!

(Silloin kun on superolo) Age 3+ | 32 pages | Otava | 2019

In the third book of the Super-series, the father and son in superhero capes talk through emotions, what makes them happy and how to make others happy, too. We all wake up on a bad mood sometimes but little by little we can turn the mood around and think positive thoughts and do small good deeds. That is when you feel super! Happiness shines through as a smile, and just like yawns – smiles are infectious.



Johanna Lestelä (b. 1984)

is a debut author, who works as a teacher and understands her young audience. Fresh illustration style and funky colours make this new series stand out.

Stella and the Grumpy Day

(Tuikun tärkeä tehtävä) Age 3+ | 28 pages | Otava | 2019

Stella is a three-year-old who is usually happy after her day at nursery, but today she has something heavy on her mind. The worry sits in her tummy and she cannot even enjoy her favourite supper: macaroni. The only one who can help is mummy. Stella tells her that she has been mean to her best friend at nursery, and mummy knows what to do: Stella must apologise to her friend.





(Tuikku ja pimeän mörkö) Age 3+ | 24 pages | Otava | 2020

Why doesn't Stella want to go to bed? The charming Stella picture book series about first experiences continues as the second book addresses children's fears.

It's time for bedtime but Stella's toys all over the place and regular evening routines are a struggle, and nothing seems to go right. When it is finally time for her to close her eyes, she can't sleep. What if a monster is hiding in the dark under her bed, Stella worries. Luckily, Mummy knows the tricks for overcoming the fear of the dark.





Matti Pikkujämsä (b. 1976)

is a Finnish front-line artist and illustrator. He is known for his portrait project, as well as making numerous children's book illustrations for various publishers in Finland and Japan. He also works on pattern design for several fashion brands. He was awarded Rudolf Koivu prize in 2013, and Finnish State Prize for Illustration in 2015. He won the first Illustrator of the Year award in 2019.



The Duck Who Was Afraid to Fly (Sorsa Aaltonen ja lentämisen oireet) Age 3+ | 32 pages | Otava | 2019

The Duck lives in a city where everyone else's lives are so interesting and important, they seem to have a purpose even in their everyday life. The Duck, however, is having strange symptoms and anxiety, and it is only when the doctor diagnoses the condition as fear of flying. The Duck's journey of gaining confidence and forgetting about what others think. Veera Salmi's wise, urban tale is brought to life in the magnificent paintings of Matti Pikkujämsä

This book has been showered with award nominations, including the Rudolf Koivu Prize in 2019, Runeberg Junior and the Arvid Lydecken Prize in 2020, and most notably the Nordic Council Prize in 2020.







Veera Salmi (b. 1976)

writes contemporary urban stories with a deep understanding of children's world and imagination. She won the Kaarina Helakisa Prize in 2014 and was nominated for Finlandia Junior in 2015 for her children's novel. Her books have been adapted for film, television, theatre and radio, and translated into Danish, Estonian, Korean and Swedish.

Elina Warsta (b. 1979)

is an illustrator of various acclaimed picture books. In 2016 she was granted with the State Prize for Children's Culture in Finland and selected for the IBBY Honour List.

Heybuddy Nursery is a picture book series, that celebrates diversity and everyday nursery life, the mood swings, fears and dramas that children encounter every day, but with all the humour, friendship and care that makes them feel safe. Each title is set in a different season and features a different protagonist, but all the children become familiar in this multi- cultural nursery. The insightful stories by Veera Salmi are illustrated with humour and colourful details by Elina Warsta.



Heybuddy Nursery 1: Rebecca's Moody Day

(Päiväkoti Heippakamu: Rebekan rapupäivä) Age 3+ | 32 pages | Otava | 2016

Rebecca is very grumpy and even her favourite plush toy Cloud struggles to cheer her up, but everyday tasks and games eventually lift her mood.



Heybuddy Nursery 2: Pablo and the Wobbly Tooth

(Päiväkoti Heippakamu: Pablo ja heiluvat hampaat) Age 3+ | 32 pages | Otava | 2017

Pablo does not want to make a show of himself, even if it is his birthday and he has a wobbly tooth. He prefers peace and quiet and playing with his skeleton, Lopez.



Heybuddy Nursery 3: Isabella and the Glimmering Girl

(Päiväkoti Heippakamu: Isabella ja tuikkiva tyttö) Age 3+ | 40 pages | Otava | 2018

Stella is new to the nursery, she wears sparkly glasses and can count in two languages. Isabella is cautious but then wants to make friends with her – luckily both girls love sparkles.



Heybuddy Nursery 4: Hung and Runaway Panther

(Päiväkoti Heippakamu: Hung ja pantteripako) Age 3+ | 32 pages | Otava | 2020

Hung is the sunshine of the nursery but when he grows restless, his heart starts beating bam-bam and turns into a ferocious panther Bam-Bam, who is even able to open the nursery gate.




Johanna Lumme (b.1990)

is an artist and illustrator, who is recognised for her illustrations in Finnish primary school books in collaboration with Siri Kolu. *The Jungle Crew* is her debut picture book. Johanna is also an illustrator of a new middle-grade series *Wild House* (see page 28).



The Jungle Crew – into the City! (Viidakon väki ja suuri muutto) Age 5+ | 32 pages | Otava | 2019


The pressing themes of climate change and migration are depicted gently in this debut picture book. The Madagascar style adventure leads into discussion about adapting into new surroundings and new beginnings. Zebra, Giraffe and Mama Hen have a good life in their home jungle until several natural disasters force them to leave their home and they end up in a big city with high buildings instead of tall trees. Working together they build a new house that will feel like home for all of them.





Linda Bondestam (b. 1977)

is one of the most celebrated illustrators of her generation and she has collaborated with numerous authors in Finland and abroad, most notably with Ulf Stark. Linda has been sitting on chair number 11 in the Swedish Children's Book Academy since 2019. She has been nominated for a number of prizes for her vivid and playful illustrations, including the ALMA and Finlandia Junior. She has won the Swedish Picture Book of the Year in 2016 and the Nordic Council Prize in 2017. Most recently, her works have been translated into Danish, English, Finnish, Italian, Latvian and Norwegian.




My Life at the Bottom

(Mitt Bottenliv) Age 4+ | 42 pages | Förlaget M | 2020

An enchanting, surprising and touching story about climate change told by the voice of an astonishing and rare axolotl, how the environment is affected, and changed. Beautifully detailed illustrations depict the wonders of the underworld.

An axolotl is a small smiling amphibian that lives its entire life at the larval stage, which means that it never really grows up. In this picture book we possibly meet the last of its kind as he thrives in his own pool enjoying his life beneath the waves. But as it gets hotter, the pool gets cloudy, and everyone moves on. Poor axolotl is left all alone. One day a giant wave sweeps away everything, and the axolotl embarks on a journey to the great unknown.



Good Night Earth

(God natt på jorden) Age 3+ | 40 pages | Förlaget M | 2018

From the savanna to the city to outer space, this book offers a charming peek at the many ways we settle in for sleep, with gorgeous, dreamlike illustrations full of offbeat humor.

Linda Bondestam's debut as a picture book author is a beautiful bedtime story that stands out with its visual storytelling, illustrations full of wit and tenderness, distinctive choice of colour, a dash of humour, varied landscape, and surprising species. Die-cut pages invite little ones to discover how all kinds of creatures find peaceful and playful ways to end the day. English edition comes out at spring 2021.





Katri Kirkkopelto (b. 1966)

is an award-winning artist, illustrator and art teacher who has a special talent for tailoring serious content to appeal to young children. She works closely with schools on material on emotional development. Her books support the child's emotional and self-regulating development, and they have been translated into Dutch, Estonian and Russian to date.



Piki - Why can't I Join in? (Piki - Minäkin haluan mukaan) Age 4+ | 32 pages | Lasten Keskus | 2016

"Pyjamaclowns are not allowed inside!" Piki stands baffled outside the club-house with a superhero cape around his shoulders. His new-found nursery friends are not allowing him to join after all, but instead slam the door in front of his nose. At home the tears fall.

Piki is a story about bullying, recurring in a group, building confidence, emotions and friendship. It was nominated for the Finlandia Junior Prize in 2016.



Piki's Stormy Day (Piki ja pöljä päivä) Age 4+ | 32 pages | Lasten Keskus |

Piki feels small and lonely at nursery, and to hide it he decides to be Storm – the wildest superhero who is not afraid of anything. But as Storm, you don't play smoothly with others, you have to quarrel, and your anger just gets worse. With cuddles, kind words and saying sorry, Storm disappears. The second book in Piki series is a moving story about group challenges, feelings, self-esteem, and friendship.



Blue (Molli) Age 4+ | 34 pages | Lasten keskus | 2016

Blue is a warm-hearted story about friendship and loneliness, longing and determination, told with compassion and humour.



Blue and the Strange One (Molli ja Kumma) 4+ | 36 pages | Lasten Keskus | 2018

As Blue and her friend Little Sisu try to find the answer to The Strange One's secret they are forced to reflect on fear, bravery and prejudice.



Blue and the Edge of the World (Molli ja maailman ääri)

Age 4+ | 40 pages | Lasten Keskus | 2019

Blue's world consists of her house and garden. Blue feels safe there but recently she has been drawn to the mysterious forest behind the stone wall.





Aleksi Korpela (b. 1986) and Meri Korpela (b. 1990)

are new to picture book publishing but the couple shares a background in art and design: they are artists, sculptors and graphic designers. Meri writes the stories and Aleksi illustrates but they share the creative process and work on the details together.




Fearless Field-mouse

A charming story about a field-mouse who reads stories about great adventures and fearless knights but who in reality is a bit scared of everything. Tove Appelgren (b. 1969)

is an author, a director and a playwright. The story about the headstrong young girl with a stressed-out mum gained international interest. Vesta-Linnéa books have been translated into 13 different languages and nominated for several prizes, including the Finlandia prize.

Salla Savolainen (b. 1962)

is a celebrated and productive illustrator, who excels in children's books and is known for her varied styles and successful collaboration with many authors. She won the Kukko award in 2013 for non-fiction.



Popular Vesta-Linnéa books centre around the headstrong, creative and curious Vesta-Linnéa, her ideas and issues with not wanting to sleep, the dream of her own dog, having dark thoughts and feeling lonely. These books address common emotions and issues, that many readers will recognise and connect with. The TV rights have been optioned for Swedish language live-action series set to go into production in 2021.

introduces familiar characters from Star Hill Stables picture book series to 6+ readers, with black and white illustrations. This series focuses on liris and her favourite pony Noble.









She has been awarded the Laivakello Prize by the Finnish Institute for Children's Literature and in the Netherlands, Siri Kolu won the Silver Slate Pencil. *Me and the Robbersons* received an honour mention in British Book Trust's In Other Words competition in 2018. Siri Kolu is a front-line author with a strong voice and a broad range from humourous middle grade to edgy YA, cross-over.

is an author, comedian, and radio personality who co-hosts the popular podcast Kaj & Ted. He writes for radio, TV and theatre.


The outrageously funny **Zoo series** about high-school life has been turned into a TV and online filmatisation, airing in 2020. Together the authors have envisioned the hilarious high school comedy inspired by their own school boy days. The books are perfect for the readers grown out of *Wimpy Kid* and illustrated in black and white by Pentti Otsamo. *Zoo #1* was nominated for Finlandia Junior Prize in 2018 and won the Torchbearer award for best foreign potential. Author Kaj Korkea-aho also received Finlandspris in 2018. The series has also been selected into a school reading programme.

The Machine-trilogy present a new side of the author: mystery adventure writer, whose page-turners can be compared to those of Veronica Roth. Helena Waris has won the Kuvastaja price, awarded by the Finnish Tolkien Society, for an unrivalled four times.

Machine trilogy is an atmospheric dystopian adventure set in a world damaged by climate crisis, where overpowering machines have taken over. How will humans survive in the world ruled by Machines?



Machine trilogy book 1: Bird Binder

(Linnunsitoja) Age 13+ | 170 pages | Otava | 2017

As the beginning of a trilogy, *Bird Binder* is an ingeniously woven mystery set in a world ruled by the omniscient Machines where freedom hangs on the delicate wings of the birds.

The helicopter takes Zemi out to sea, to a lighthouse island beyond the watchful eyes of the State, the Chasms and the Machines. The island forms the base of the resistance movement. A dovecote sits atop the lighthouse. The birds carry messages across the sea; the only method of communication not governed by the Machine. The birds are the only way the Resistance can survive.



Machine trilogy book 2: Waterspinner

(Vedenkehrääjä) Age 13+ | 157 pages | Otava | 2018

Waterspinner is set in a postecocatastrophe world ruled by all-knowing machines. After a crisis on the remote lighthouse island where the resistance group was based, their leader, Saz, ends up on the other side of the ocean. While searching for a friend, he travels through a devastated land where water resources are evaporating. In the midst of refugee floods and cities buried in sand, Saz has to choose which future he wants to fight for.



Machine trilogy book 3: Icewarden

(Jäänvartija) Age 13+ | 218 pages | Otava | 2019

After the resistance was wiped out by the Machines, Thom has lived low key in Mahar, but when he catches an encrypted radio message with unexpected information, secrets are revealed. Thom finds out that the continents are in turmoil. With chaos spreading, Thom and his friends head north, where no humans are known to live. The book that ends the ingeniously threaded mystery of Machine-trilogy turns everything we have learned so far on its head.




Nonna Wasiljeff (b. 1983)


Grim Boy was nominated for Topelius Prize in 2019 and Russian rights have been sold to date.

15-year-old Aaron has always lived in the imprisonment camp – Grim. It is dominated by the ruthless, mysterious Dusts. To survive, the best strategy is to keep your head down and obey the rules. Otherwise, the Dusts will drag you to the Second Level – where unimaginable horrors take place and from where only a few return. But the Second Level is also the only way out. Courage and innocence are Aaron's only weapons until he discovers his dormant powers.

In the second book, the imprisonment camp Grim does not let Aaron out of its grip. Aaron has fled from the Grim, only to end up living among the fearsome Dusts, as one of them. His newly discovered powers rave fear and attract strange characters to him. He is relentlessly followed by a shadowy nocturna Lazar, who is watching Aaron's every move. Aaron struggles to get through the novice Dust training but when a new friend of his is captured by the Dusts, he is forced to face once again the terrors of Grim.

is a TV and radio journalist, a producer and an author of five inspirational books.

Matti Pikkujämsä (b. 1976)

is an award-winning Finnish artist and illustrator, who won the first Illustrator of the Year award in 2019 (see page 20)



Moments Before the World Changed

(Hetki ennen kuin maailma muuttui) Age 6+ | 80 pages | Otava | 2019

What happened when a boy with stage fright received a guitar and overcame his fears? How did a disobedient girl on a bus start a battle for human rights? Who were the first creatures on the dark side of the Moon? It turns out we didn't know all about Elvis. Rosa Parks' story is familiar to us, but who has heard about Claudette Colvin? Laika the Dog has gone down in history but not the turtles who paved the way for the Moon landing.

Linda Liukas (b. 1986)






